Jessie Sima (they/them) is an author and illustrator of picture books. Their debut picture book Not Quite Narwhal became a New York Times bestseller five years after publication. The book is the first in a trilogy, which includes Perfectly Pegasus and the last book, Weather Together, which comes out in May from Simon & Schuster.

Not Quite Narwhal was optioned by DreamWorks Animation and is currently being turned into an animated series that will air on Netflix in 2023.

Jessie has written other pictures books

including Love Z, Hardly Haunted and Spencer's New Pet. They are currently working on a book about time travel and cookies which will be out in 2024.

Susan Stockdale is excited to announce the publication of her picture book,


